



Biography of Evandro Menezes de Carvalho

Evandro Menezes de Carvalho (高文勇) is a Brazilian scholar of international law and one of the leading specialists on China–Brazil relations, Chinese governance, and global governance from a Global South perspective.

He currently serves as Professor Coordinator at Macao Polytechnic University (MPU), while on leave from his position as Associate Professor of International Law at the Fluminense Federal University (UFF), Brazil, where he is also a founding member of the Center for BRICS Countries Studies. For nearly two decades, he was a Professor at the Getulio Vargas Foundation (FGV Law School in Rio de Janeiro), where he held key leadership roles, including Coordinator of the Graduate Law Program and Vice-Dean. He is also a Wutong Chair Professor at the Beijing Language and Culture University (BLCU), China, since 2024.

In addition, he serves as Vice President of the State Commission on Brazil–China Relations at the Rio de Janeiro section of the Brazilian Bar Association (OAB-RJ), contributing to strengthening legal and institutional cooperation between Brazil and China.

Professor Carvalho has built a distinguished academic trajectory with deep institutional engagement in China. He has been a Senior Visiting Scholar at Peking University's School of Government and a Senior Visiting Research Fellow at the Institute for Global Cooperation and Understanding (iGCU). He also held positions as Senior Foreign Expert at Fudan University and Visiting Professor at Shanghai University under China's National High-end Foreign Expert Program. Earlier in his career, he was selected as a Senior Scholar at the Shanghai University of Finance and Economics through the China Scholarship Council program.

His academic formation includes a Ph.D. in International Law from the University of São Paulo (USP), with research conducted at the Université Paris-Sorbonne (Paris IV). He completed postdoctoral studies at the Université de Montréal, where he received the Faculty Enrichment Award. He also holds a master's degree in law and Latin American integration from Federal University of Santa Maria (UFSM) and a law degree from the Federal University of Pernambuco (UFPE).

Professor Carvalho's contributions have been widely recognized. In 2023, he was awarded the Chinese Government Friendship Award, the highest honor granted by the Chinese government to foreign experts, in recognition of his contributions to China's modernization and international cooperation. In the same year, he received the Cross of Merit of Fraternal Brazil-China Integration from the Brazilian National Congress. In 2025, he was honored with the World Sinology Outstanding Achievement Award.

His intellectual work focuses on Chinese legal and political institutions, China's modernization process, BRICS cooperation, the Belt and Road Initiative, and the transformation of global governance. He has played a key role in advancing academic and policy dialogue between China and Latin America. Notably, he led the "Belt and Road & Brazil (BR&Br)" project at FGV, fostering research and publication on China–Brazil relations.

Professor Carvalho is the author and editor of several influential works. His book *China: Tradição e Modernidade na Governança do País (China: Tradition and Modernity in the Country's Governance)* (2024) achieved top ranking in its category on Amazon. He also co-edited *Arbitration and Mediation in Brazil and China* (FGV Editora, 2022), a significant contribution to comparative legal studies.

In addition to his academic work, he is Chief Executive Editor of *China Hoje*, the Brazilian edition of *China Today* magazine, published by China International Communication Group (CICG). Through this platform and his frequent media engagements, he contributes to shaping public understanding of China in Brazil and beyond.

Professor Carvalho is a founding member of the World Association of China Studies (WACS) and the Brazilian Network of Chinese Studies (RBChina). He has also served as President of the Brazilian Law Teaching Association (ABEDi). He participates in international advisory and dialogue platforms, including the Global Young Leaders Dialogue. His career reflects a sustained commitment to fostering intellectual exchange, legal cooperation, and mutual understanding between China, Brazil, and the broader Global South.
